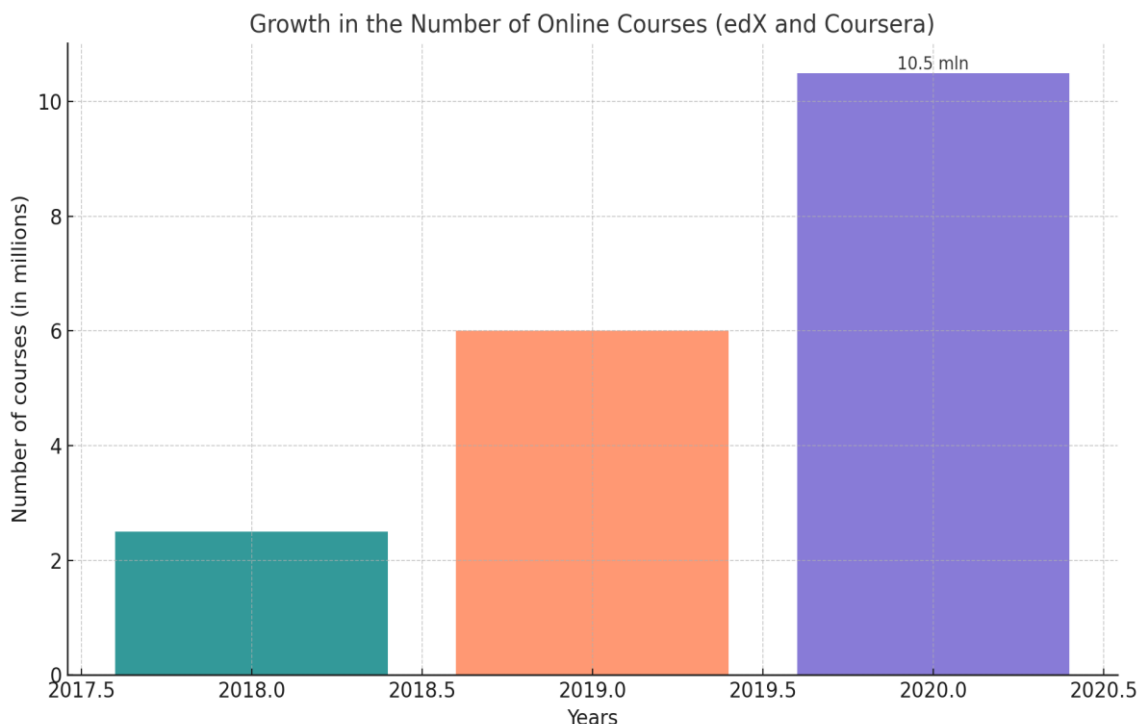

expenses. On the other hand, there is also a lack of flexibility for students. The study schedule is rigid, making it difficult for students to always adapt their time. For example, in traditional classes held in every university or school, students attend classes in classrooms.

Additionally, according to Statista, in 2019, 72% of the total education services market worldwide was made up of offline education.
